


A few facts

- 45-50 million tonnes of aggregates and sand produced p.a.
- Consumption is 9 tonnes per head of population
- 250 tonnes of aggregate is used in an average house
- 1 km of two-lane highway requires 14,000t of aggregate



2020 Product Uses





We are in a time of significant change with added focus on:

 Climate change mitigation/transition to a low emissions economy

• Sustainable practices

Greater protection of the environment

• Significant investment in infrastructure.



Key issues:



- Access to resources in close proximity to markets
- Reverse sensitivity (NIMBYism)
- Challenges to social licence
- A belief that alternatives exist to use of virgin aggregates (recycling, timber etc.)

Our Resource Management system needs an overhaul

- Simple quarry consents are taking 5 years
- Exhaustive appeal rights hold up all applications
- Project delays and cost blow-outs common





Increasing emphasis on climate related risk/opportunities

- Government requirement
- Govt Emissions reduction plan
- Requirements on major projects
- More and more customers asking us to explain what we are doing to reduce emissions
- Response to natural disasters.
