

EU LEGISLATIVE PROCEDURE


The European Commission tables a legislative proposal (Regulation, Directive, Decision) ~ 100 proposals/year



SELECTION OF CURRENT TOP PRIORITIES


- EU (Critical) Raw Materials Act Improved permitting procedures and land-use planning; local access to resources for critical, strategic and essential raw materials needed for adapting to climate change, the EU Green Deal's renovation wave, energy transition (RePowerEU) and military infrastructure
- Nature Restoration Law (NRL) Ensuring sustainable access to resources and promoting the industry's contribution to restoration of nature, biodiversity and ecosystems
- Respirable Crystalline Silica Provide an adequate control, measures and worker's protection under the NEPSI Social Dialogue Agreement
- Review of the Construction Products Regulation (CPR) Aggregates in construction products, technical standards, declaration of performance (DoP) and CE marking
- European Technical Standards Reviewing comprehensive European Aggregates Standards (CEN TC 154 and related bodies)



SELECTION OF CURRENT TOP PRIORITIES

- Biodiversity Strategy to 2030 30% protected areas, 10% strictly protected areas; EU Guidance and compatibility with aggregates extraction; improved sustainable access to local resources
- **Biodiversity Indicators** The European Aggregates Industry can be a net contributor to biodiversity; UEPG supports 'Temporary Nature' and 'Dynamic management of biodiversity' and develops biodiversity indicators by 2025.
- Resource Taxation (part of Circular Economy) Pro & Cons; providing alternatives to achieve resource efficiency and high recycling rates without resource taxation
- Recycling (part of Circular Economy) Potential & limitations, trends and changing business models, exchange of good practice; complementary use of primary and secondary raw materials
- EU Health & Safety legislation Better regulation of EU Occupational Health and Safety Directives
- Better/Smarter Regulation Better Implementation of existing legislation and Regulatory Enforcement ensuring a competitive industry

THE EUROPEAN AGGREGATES NDUSTRY.


The European Aggregates demand is **3 billion** tons per year The European Aggregates Industry comprises 15,000 companies (mostly SMEs) and producing aggregates at

26.500 sites across Europe The European average demand for aggregates is around 6 tons per capita per year

The industry employs around 185.000 people (including contractors)




TREND IN EU27+UK+EFTA





ANALYSIS BY TYPE FOR 2021 & TREND




Sand & gravel 38.7%, crushed rock 47.7%, recycled 9.4%, manufactured 2.2%, marine 2.1%

THE LEAGUE TABLE IN 2021




Ranges from 584mt for Germany down to 1.6mt for Malta

- Average for EU27+UK+EFTA (3.079bnt/529m people) was 5.8t/c







